

PROLOGUE

Bowls has been accepted as one of the oldest games on earth, centuries before the birth of Christ.

The game was recorded in Latin as the "casting of stones" (jactus lapidum) which was probably the origin of the word Jack.

History recalls the episode on the 19th July 1585. Sir Francis Drake declining pleas and understandable concerns of his Naval colleagues, continued his bowls as the Spanish Armada approached Plymouth Hoe.

In Australia the first recorded club game took place in 1845. The contest was played on a green constructed beside the Beach Tavern at Sandy Bay, Hobart.

Shortly after, the Parramatta Bowling Club our first recorded club was formed in NSW.

it wasn't until the last quarter of the 19th Century that the bowling associations of NSW and Victoria were established in 1880. In 1892 the Scottish Bowling Association was formed. Then in rapid succession came several independent bodies. The multiplicity of organisations proved a hindrance and joined the English Bowling Association in 1905.

Since then accredited teams of players from Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Canada and the United States have visited Great Britain and British teams have returned those visits.

THE CHALLENGE


The year was 1983, the place Camden Haven Golf Club Bar. The voices were members of the club. During a few drinks a voice was heard to utter the words, "I wish we had a Bowling Green". There was a loud reply, "Why don't you build your own, here at the Golf Club".

All was quite and then an eruption of laughter. "I'm quite serious", said the late Herb Burgess. After further discussions over a few more drinks, it was agreed to place a proposal before the Golf Club Board of Directors.

On the 10th August 1983 a special meeting was called to discuss the Bowling Green. At this meeting it was agreed to proceed with the project with no expense to the Golf Club.

To obtain some finance, an application was filed on the 20th September with the Dept. of Leisure and Sports for a grant.

The President of the Golf Club, Bob Knox called a meeting on the 6th November 1983 to elect a committee to oversee the development of the Bowling Green.




Leon Lawrence (left) Locating the green to Jack Smith (centre) and Bill Pickering

CONSTRUCTION

In June 1984 Bruce Watt driving his vintage bulldozer excavated the first sods of the project.

The steering committee at this stage had set a target date to complete the bowling green by December 1984.

Herb Burgess and the construction volunteers all agreed that the most important aspect of a successful bowling green is the drainage. Following numerous discussions the design was finalised.




The Herringbone drainage design which operates efficiently today.

CONSTRUCTION

Considering that all labour was volunteered, machinery begged, borrowed or freely supplied with driver it was a great effort by all.

On the day that the final fill was levelled and most of the hard work finished. Imagine the relief and satisfaction in the minds of the many volunteers.

an Air force jet flew over.


One bird said to the other, "boy, he was going fast".

Then came the time for the big decision; Grass; what's it to be, Couch, Tiff Dwarf or what. the answer came from Pat Trotter, (a retired green keeper.) Wauchope were coring their green at the time and Wauchope's green was renowned as the best in the district.

Pat was advising Wauchope at the time, so it was no trouble for him to gather all their Tiff Dwarf drillings and transfer them to the Kew Green. This was in November 1984.



THE OPENING

September 22nd 1985

The big day arrived our official opening of the Bowling Green. It was on Sunday 22nd September 1985.

The plaque was fixed to the wall of the club house. The opening was performed by Jack Ball, President of the NSW Bowling Association. Mr Ball said he could identify with the struggles met and overcome in endeavours to establish the green. He also recognised the tremendous input from the voluntary labour which enabled the green to become a reality.

Jack Ball unveiled the plaque to officially open the green, then bowled the first bowl.

LIFE TO THE GREEN

It was in September 1986 that the Herb Burgess Bowling Green Plaque was transferred from the Club wall to it's present position.

On the 7th October 1986 the NSW Womens Bowling Association President, Dot Johnson unveiled the Plaque commemorating the formation of the Ladies Club.

The Herb Burgess Green was now fully consecrated by the Ladies and Men of the Camden Haven Club. The Club's Bowling Green and Bowlers became renowned and respected throughout the Mid North Coast.







The first year of bowls on the green was 1986. At that time there were 16 Lady Bowlers and 22 Men Bowlers.

The men fielded their first Pennant Team in 1986 in Grade 5. In their first year they eluded the District Flag by a Half Point.

It was in this same year that Barry Isaac won the District Single Champion of Champions.



The highlight of the Lower North Coast District Pennant Season in 1987 was the success story of the Camden haven Bowling Club in winning Two Pennants Flags, Grade 5 and Grade 7. by winning both Grades the men claimed the record on the North Coast for the Club to win Two Pennant Grades in their second year of operation. Facts may prove that it may also be a State Record.



In 1987, one of our Pennants players decided to start a Bowls Training School for Disabled Persons.

Les Jones received the full backing of the committee and he commenced lessons on Friday 1st January 1987. Due to Les's staunch effort and persistency the venture was very successful and the members gave him the Title of "The Little King".

On the 30th October and 1st November 1987 Camden haven held their inaugural Invitation Classic Triples. The prize money was \$1,000.00 sponsored by Wauchope Motors and Kew Real Estate. The winning team comprised of T. McCoy, J. Ramm, and R. Whitehead.

1988 proved a very successful year for th Bowling Club. The Ladies played their first Pennants games in 1987 Grade 5 and only won one match. Then in 1988 the Grade 5 team won six out of eight matches taking out the 1988 Pennant Flag.

The men entered two Grades in the 1988 Pennants 3's and 5's. This year they were successful with the Grade 3 Team.



It was in this year that we were successful in the District Championships.


J. O'Neill & G. Denton were Zone Club Pairs Champions.

After winning the Grade 3 Pennants in 1988 the men were elevated to Grade 2 in 1989 and were once again successful in taking out the Flag.






