A Brief History of Lawn Bowling

The actual origin of the game is hidden in the haze of antiquity, but there is, however, authentic records of well over seven hundred years of bowling history.

Sculptured vases and ancient plaques show the game being played some four thousand years ago, and archaeologists have uncovered biased stone bowls from 5,000BC, which indicate our ancestors enjoyed the game of bowls more than seven thousand years ago.

When Caesar ruled Rome, the game was known as bocce, and the conquering Roman Legions may well have carried the game to Europe and the British Isles. By the thirteenth century, bowling had spread to France, Switzerland, Italy, Spain, Belgium, Germany and England.


Bowling was so well established in England by 1299AD, that a group of players organised the Southampton Old Bowling Green Club, the oldest established bowling club in the world that is still active. The game became so popular in England and France it was prohibited by law because archery, essential to the national defense, was being neglected. The French King, Charles IV, prohibited the game for the common people in 1319, and King Edward III issued a similar edict in England in 1361.

Fortunately, bowling was not supressed in Scotland, where it attained popularity which has increased with the years. Scotlish bowlers developed the present flat green game, established rules, worked out a uniform code of laws and were instrumental in saving the game for posterity. To the Scots goes the credit also for giving the game an international background, as emigrant Scots enthusiastically carried the game with them to all parts of the world.

Bowls has much literary and historical proof of being the real 'Sport of Kings'. From the time of Edward III, the game was restricted by royal decree to 'Noblemen and others having manors or lands'. Successive kings played and enjoyed the game, however, King Henry III, who had bowling greens installed at Whitehall, permitted the common people to play on Christmas Day. Almost every English monarch was a bowler, and the royal estates were all equipped with fine bowling greens. King James I was an ardent bowler, as was his

son King Charles I. Both monarchs are reputed to have enjoyed playing for high stakes. King Charles, according to bowling tradition, lost over £5,000 in one encounter with a merchant named Richard Schute. A bowling green has been a permanent fixture at Windsor Castle. Anne Boleyn was a bowler, as were many noblewomen, including the first Princess Elizabeth and Queen Victoria. The Queen Mary and King Edward V enjoyed the game of bowls. Edward VIII, the Duke of Windsor, was president of the Royal Household Bowling Club of Windsor Castle. His brother King George VI, was an enthusiastic bowler and Patron of the English Bowling Association.

History of Camden Haven Bowling Club

The Challenge

The year was 1983, the place the Camden Haven Golf Club bar. The voices were members of the club. During a few drinks a voice was heard to utter the words, 'I wish we had a bowling green'. There was a loud reply, 'Why don't you build your own here at the Golf Club?'

All was quiet and then an eruption of laughter. *'I'm quite serious'*, said the late Herb Green. After further discussions over a few more drinks, it was agreed to place a proposal before the Golf Club Board of Directors.

On 10 August 1983 a special meeting was called to discuss the bowling green. At this meeting it was agreed to proceed with the project at no expense to the Golf Club.

To obtain some finance, an application was filed on 20 September with the Department of Leisure and Sports for a grant.

The Project

The President of the Golf Club, Bob Knox, called a meeting on 6 November 1983 to elect a committee to oversee the development of the bowling green. The committee so elected was:

President: Leon Lawrence Secretary/Treasurer: Bill Pickering

Committee: Herb Burgess, Barrie Isaac, Percy Jones, Reg French, Jack Smith and

Bruce Watts.

Construction

In June 1984, Bruce Watts driving his vintage bulldozer, excavated the first sods of the project. The steering committee at this stage had set a target date to complete the bowling green by December 1984.

Herb Burgess and the construction volunteers all agreed that the most important aspect of a successful bowling green is the drainage. Following numerous discussions the designed was finalised.

Considering that all labour was volunteered, machinery begged, borrowed or freely supplied with driver it was a great effort by all.

On the day that the final fill was levelled and most of the hard work finished, imagine the relief and satisfaction in the minds of the many volunteers!

Then came the rime for the big decision: Grass – what's it to be? Couch, Tiff Dwarf or what?? The answer came from Pat Trotter (a retired green keeper) – Wauchope were coring their green at the time and Wauchope's green was renowned as the best in the district. Pat was advising Wauchope at the time, so it was no trouble for him to gather all their Tiff Dwarf drillings and transfer them to the Kew green. This was in November 1984.

Forming the Bowling Club

In August 1985 the founder members of the Bowling Club held their inaugural meeting to elect Executive and Committee. The following officers were elected:

President: Bruce Watt

Vice President: Bob Knox

Secretary/Treasurer: Bill Pickering

Committee: Leon Lawrence, Barry Isaac, John Turnbull, Jack Kelly.

The main consideration of this meeting was the cost of the green. The total cost to date amounted to \$10,700; this included a Sports Grant of \$6,000.

Mr Jack Ball, President of the Royal NSW Bowling Association officially opened the green on Sunday 22 September 1985 saying that he could identify with the struggles met and overcome in the endeavours to establish the green and also recognised the tremendous input from the voluntary labour, which enabled the green to become a reality. After unveiling the plaque to officially open the green he then delivered the first bowl

Women's Bowling Club

On Tuesday, 17 September 1985, 17 women met for the Inaugural Meeting of the Camden Haven Golf Women's Bowling Club with guest speakers Isabelle Ellis (Hasting Haven District President), Lorna Tuck (President North Haven Ladies Bowling Club) and Audrey Kelly (Assistant Secretary, Wauchope) attending to provide invaluable experience.

At the end of that meeting donations of \$19.00 were received to open the Club's Bank account.

The Men's Club Committee was approached with an application to have Tuesday as the ladies' official bowling day. The first game of bowls was played the following Tuesday – 24 September 1985.

The Foundation President was Fay Knox, the Secretary Joan Turnbull and one of the Vice Presidents was Margaret Watts. These three ladies have bowled continuously for the past 30 years and their names appear regularly on our Club's *Championship Honour Boards*.

Affiliation with the New South Wales Women's Bowling Association (as it was then known) occurred on 28 October 1985.

On 7 October 1986 the New South Wales Women's Bowling Association President, Dot Johnson, unveiled a plaque commemorating the formation of the Ladies' Club.

In 1987 the Ladies played their first Pennants games in Grade 5 and only won one match. Then in 1988 the grade 5 team won six out of eight matches taking out the 1988 Grade 5 Pennant flag.
